Our Youth In Government students attended a pre-conference workshop, and many 10th graders explored the Center for a Sustainable Future at LISD Tech. About 16 students will take the PSAT/NMSQT this Thursday. Fall sports are wrapping up with several teams heading into postseason play.

J. Terakedis - saving is needed - final budget isn't there from the state, enrollment numbers aren't

yet; statewide declining enrollment is a challenging issue.

K. Roe - asked where are the kids (in regards to enrollment decline)? Will there be lay-offs?

J. Terakedis - statewide decline/problem; decline in birth rates and family expansions; no new

subdivisions, new families in the area, etc

R. Tessier - Speaking as 1 of 7, we have awesome staff and we understand that decisions that are made affect the staff and students in the district, we do not take that lightly

The Robocats will be competing on December 7th at Columbia Central in their first competition.

COMMITTEE REPORT

The Grounds Committee met October 9th, 2025 to discuss the work needing to be done around the school; alternative assessments were discussed and the minimum work necessary was reviewed to assess if it is needed to maintain current facilities and what repairs are currently needing immediate attention. Additionally, involvement with athletics was assessed and how volunteers, families can be partnered with to accomplish the upkeep and maintenance to athletic fields. Discussion of bond

proposals and needs were briefing discussed and status of current sinking funds assessed.

J. Terakedis spoke to the information that bonds/millage funds are separate funds from budget and general funds for school. The money does not overlap and cannot be used to cover/assess the same gaps/fund purposes.

The Finance Committee met October 20th, 2025 proceeding to the regular board meeting to discuss the annual finance audit of 2024-2025. The financial audit for the 2024-2025 year was reviewed.

Terakedis - special thank you to Karen Springer, and her family, for taking the time to get everything back to square one, putting everything back to where it belongs. Thank you for your hard work, dedication, sacrifice; giving up many hours of your personal time and family time to get everything done and for the District. Thank you to Erica Metcalf, of Maner CPA, for her hard work helping us get back to basics and get everything back to the right way. A.Gast -This is the second year in a deficit of spending. Fund Balance finished the year at 14% which is above Board policy minimum of 12%. There are three accounts over budget. There is improvement in financial management over

the course of the last year (pay bills on time, paying taxes, benefits, etc).

R. Tessier - sharing the District is a way to help get out of the challenging place we are in. Sharing positive words and the great things that we are doing here in Onsted; increasing enrollment and student count helps our financial outlook.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

Presented by Superintendent Jonathan Royce: The HVAC upgrades across the District. The Facilities department is currently down one custodian and J. Kelly is working to redistribute custodians and workload as necessary.

Food Service acquired a new grant to get new Lattes in the High School Cafeteria!

The Transportation Department is down a regular route bus driver, the newly hired regular route bus driver passed their driving test and is able to be driving on the roads starting tomorrow!

Tech Inspection - HS Audio speaker system is done.

More professional development and learning to be prepared and adapt to the new Michigan Dyslexia Law. Elementary bringing in Hands-on learning with Hydroponics. Parent Teacher Conferences coming up next week. Athletics has completed seasons for Girls' Golf and Boys' Soccer; Volleyball and Football are wrapping up with senior nights scheduled. Cross Country is wrapping up as well. Mr. Hiram is planning Winter and Spring schedules. Finance - currently still under spending and hiring freeze across the District. The State Aid Loan has been secured. Middle School received new grants for three teachers in math, social studies, and trades. Elementary had a great fundraiser for their pumpkin sale for the 5th grade class. High School Haunted Hallways and Elementary Trunk or Treat is next week - come out and support! The Band has their Glow Show next week! They perform in the dark, by memorization and glowing instruments.
