





- 1 Understanding the Schedule
- 2 Know how your student gets to and from school
- Maneuvering the parking lot
- 4 Locker combination- go a little past the last number to unlock
- Supplies- the first week- only worry about a folder for information and a writing utensil

Printed schedules do not show the whole year- because it can seem overwhelming and confusing.

You see this 9 weeks.

Lockers- Kind of tricky- we work on this a lot during the first week


Supplies- you don't need it all right now- or even on the first day.

Communication:


Website- info that you can refer to- day schedule, handbook, emails, phones numbers.




Teacher communication:






FYI
